POLAR BEARS AND SEALS


The Little Polar Bear's name is Lars. In the film, he makes friends with a seal called Robby.

Here is a picture of Lars and Robby.



Then, pretend to be Lars and the whale with a friend. What sort of things do you think they would say to each other?




AFTER YOU HAVE SEEN THE FILM
