

Caring for Animals - Introduction

This activity sheet asks pupils to think about the importance of caring for animals properly.

Caring for Animals – Pupil Worksheet

When the son of the French Ambassador, Raoul, is given the tiger cub Sangha as a pet, he does a very good job of looking after him.

He:

- feeds him
- gives him water and milk
- keeps him clean and well-groomed
- plays with him
- strokes him and loves him.



Because of the care that Raoul shows Sangha, the tiger cub loves Raoul back and becomes gentle and loving – so much so, that he is even allowed to sleep in Raoul's bed, even though he's a tiger!

Use Raoul and Sangha as good examples of how to look after your pet. Create a 'Looking After Your Pet' leaflet, showing all of the things that Raoul does to make sure that Sangha is happy and healthy. Use pictures and words to get your message across.
