<p>Wallchart – worksheets 1 & 2 'Welcome to his jungle'</p> <p>Literacy Science</p> <p>3-4 hours Ages 8-11</p>	<p>Literacy: Film Narrative Develop a storyboard for the narrative by capturing and importing key images into a presentation programme. Children write their own version of the zoo keeper copying animal behaviour, organising and writing into paragraphs. Extension: create a multimodal presentation of this version including images, voice-over, soundtrack and written text</p> <p>Science – Life Processes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - that the life processes common to humans and other animals include nutrition, movement, growth and reproduction - to make links between life processes in familiar animals and plants and the environments in which they are found 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - investigate behaviour traits of the gorilla; bear; lion or Capuchin monkey - create a storyboard depicting the zoo keeper copying the behaviour of one of these animals 	<p>Access to filmeducation.org/zookeeper (for animal information)</p> <p>Zookeeper wallchart worksheet 2 – storyboard template</p>	<p>Literacy: organise and present whole texts effectively, sequencing and structuring information, ideas and events</p> <p>Science: Communicating and collaborating in Science – across a range of contexts and practical situations pupils will select appropriate ways of presenting scientific data</p>
